<p>Exposure to COVID-19</p> <p>The virus is spread in minute water droplets that are expelled from the body through sneezing, coughing, talking and breathing. The virus can be transferred to the hands and from there to surfaces. It can survive on surfaces for a period after transfer (depending on such things as the surface type, its moisture content and temperature).</p>	<p>Everyone on site.</p> <p>General transmission may occur through close contact between colleagues, learners and visitors and touching contaminated surfaces.</p>	H	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Anyone displaying symptoms of COVID-19 or in a household where someone is displaying symptoms of COVID-19 or who is contacted by Test and Trace must follow current guidance relating to self-isolation and testing. Staff informed about the Test and Trace service. Social distancing maintained wherever possible between all adults on site and between learner groups (see attached guidance). Frequent handwashing for a minimum of 20 seconds duration promoted. Hand sanitiser available in classrooms, shared spaces, entrance and exit points. Regular cleaning of surfaces touched by learners, staff and visitors Surfaces cleaned with Zoono once every 24 hours. This product causes the pathogen to break up with lethal effect and carries on working for 24 hours. Review COSHH assessment for hand sanitiser and cleaning materials. Review cleaning schedules. Signage used to promote hygiene (respiratory and hand) and social distancing. Review stocks of soap, hand sanitiser, tissues. Staff, parents/carers and visitors informed of the measures in place to reduce transmission. We accept that doing rescue breaths will increase the risk of transmitting the COVID-19 virus, either to the rescuer or the child. However, the risk is small compared to the risk of taking no action as this will result in certain cardiac arrest and the death of the child.</i>					

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Risk Rating

The risk rating is used to prioritise the action required. Deal with those hazards that are high risk first.

Risk Rating	Description	Action Priority
High	Where harm is certain or near certain to occur and/or major injury or ill-health could result	Urgent action
Medium	Where harm is possible to occur and/or serious injury could result e.g. off work for over 3 days	Medium priority
Low	Where harm is unlikely or seldom to occur and/or minor injury could result e.g. cuts, bruises, strain	No action or low priority action
