Below we have provided a brief overview of the GCSE English Language and Literature courses and how we will be working in class to prepare our learners for their GCSE examinations set out by the **Eduqas WJEC** examination board.

Firstly, we would like to outline the **details** of the exam system:

- Qualification is un-tiered (one paper - no foundation and higher)
- Qualification is assessed by examination only (no coursework)
- Graded 1 to 9

At The JCB Academy we are teaching English Literature and English Language to **all** of our learners as we believe that the skills to pass each exam are interchangeable and offer a broader scope of study and achievement. A detailed breakdown of the exam structure is attached.

We would like to emphasise the importance of working to the best of their ability, in order to support the learners in their preparations the department provides revision materials on Google Classroom every Monday, this work is designed to help with embedding skills and practicing GCSE style tasks. We strongly advise our learners to engage with the set tasks. Additionally, please find useful revision website links at the bottom of this letter.

<p><u>Component 2</u></p> <p>19th and 21st Century Non-Fiction Reading and Transactional/Persuasive Writing</p> <p>Written examination: 2 hours 60% of qualification</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Section A (30%): Reading Understanding of two extracts (about 900-1200 words in total) of high-quality non-fiction writing, one from the 19th century, the other from the 21st century, assessed through a range of structured questions • Section B (30%): Writing Two compulsory transactional/persuasive writing tasks 	<p><u>Component 2</u></p> <p>Post-1914 Prose/Drama, 19th Century Prose and Unseen Poetry</p> <p>Written examination: 2 hours and 30 minutes 60% of qualification</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Section A (20%): Post-1914 prose/drama <i>Lord of the Flies</i> by William Golding (covered in Y10) One source-based question on a post-1914 prose/drama on <i>The Woman in Black</i> or <i>Lord of the Flies</i> • Section B (20%): 19th century prose <i>A Christmas Carol</i> by Charles Dickens One source-based question on a 19th century prose text from <i>The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde</i> (covered in Y10)
